

Swiss doctors and nurses on a mission to improve medical care in Laos

For over 25 years, medical professionals from Switzerland have been supporting Laotian hospitals with their expertise. Through continuous training and further education of local staff, we are improving healthcare in a sustainable manner.

In 2024, 77 volunteers served for about 1,200 days on site. They all work without pay, so your donation will go entirely toward the project work.

The Swiss Laos Hospital Project at a glance

Child mortality in Laos is 10 times higher than in Switzerland. Many treatments that we take for granted are not available because public hospitals lack the expertise and resources.

The Swiss Laos Hospital Project is a Swiss non-profit organization that aims to improve healthcare in Laos through medical training, expert advice, and financial contributions. The focus is on partnership-based cooperation with specialists in Laos.

Our members are doctors, nurses, and other medical professionals who regularly volunteer in Laotian hospitals. Their areas of expertise include gynecology and obstetrics, neonatology, internal medicine, psychiatry, and hospital management. Our approach is based on mutual learning, professional exchange, and locally anchored solutions.

Our projects are coordinated with the Lao Ministry of Health through a memorandum of understanding. We are committed to the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

The Swiss Laos Hospital Project has been organized as an association since 2000 and has been certified by Zewo since 2018. It is run exclusively by volunteer work and financed by donations.



Our strategy

In accordance with its overall strategy 2024–2028, the Swiss Laos Hospital Project contributes to improving healthcare in Laos, particularly by reducing child and maternal mortality.

To this end, it supports public hospitals throughout Laos on a medical, organizational, and financial level.

The aim is to jointly develop expertise and structures in accordance with the following principles:

- Partnership based
 We treat our colleagues in Laos as equals. Decisions are made jointly, with responsibility remaining with the Laotian institutions.
- Sustainable
 We are aligning ourselves with the UN Sustainable
 Development Goals (SDGs) and the Lao Health Sector
 Reform Strategy 2021–2030.
- Impact-oriented
 We focus on the areas where our partners see the greatest need and combine training, advice, and targeted financial support.



1. Health care for mothers and their newborns

Providing better care for mothers before and after childbirth and for their newborns is the most important area of activity for the Swiss Laos Hospital Project in terms of both finances and personnel. To this end, our two working groups, Gynecology & Obstetrics and Neonatology, work closely with the Mother and Newborn Hospital (MNH) in Vientiane and various provincial hospitals. The fact that up to 35 newborns can now be treated professionally in the MNH's neonatology department is largely thanks to this commitment.



2. General internal medicine

A working group of internists and general practitioners is primarily active in the province of Xieng Khouang. Its goal is to improve basic care in the district hospitals of Muang Kham and Nong Het and their affiliated health centers. To this end, regular workshops and bedside teaching sessions are held for medical staff, and scholarships are awarded for further training. Infrastructure projects are also financed on a case-by-case basis, such as the construction of a maternity ward and a pediatrics ward in Muang Kham.



3. Psychiatry

The treatment of mental disorders is currently virtually unavailable in Laos. Our psychiatrists in the Mental Health Working Group are therefore doing pioneering work in the field of adult and adolescent psychiatry. To this end, they hold conferences, workshops, and bedside teaching sessions. In order to establish this field of medicine in Laos, they also award scholarships for specialist training in psychiatry and psychotherapy in the neighboring country of Thailand.



4. Hospital management

The Swiss Laos Hospital Project focuses on providing professional training for medical staff. However, even well-trained doctors and nurses can only perform their job to the best of their ability if they operate within a well-functioning organization. That is why our specialists advise the Laotian Ministry of Health on hospital management issues and organize courses on leadership and organizational topics for hospital managers.
